## Guide to Pending and Recently Signed California Cannabis Bills (2018)

Bill Number Author	Summary	Result
<a href="#">AB 1741</a> (Bonta)	This bill temporarily exempts a person required to pay or collect cannabis excise or cultivation taxes from the requirement to remit amounts due by electronic funds transfer (EFT).	Signed on 8/28/18
<a href="#">AB 2164</a> (Cooley)	This bill allows a local agency to impose administrative fines immediately for certain violations due to illegal cultivation of cannabis.	Signed on 9/10/18
<a href="#">AB 3067</a> (Chau)	This bill adds any cannabis, cannabis product, cannabis business, or any instrument or paraphernalia that is designed for the smoking or ingestion of cannabis or cannabis products to the list of products or services subject to the Privacy Rights for California Minors in the digital World (PRCMDC).	Signed on 9/11/18
<a href="#">AJR 27</a> (Low)	This measure urges the United States Department of Justice not to direct its enforcement priorities towards California's lawfully and closely regulated cannabis industry.	Chaptered on 8/20/18
<a href="#">AB 1793</a> (Bonta)	This bill expedites the identification, review, and notification of individuals who may be eligible for recall or dismissal, dismissal and sealing, or redesignation of specified cannabis-related convictions.	Pending Governor Action
<a href="#">AB 1863</a> (Jones-Sawyer)	This bill allows taxpayers subject to Personal Income Tax Law to deduct ordinary and necessary business expenses attributable to commercial cannabis activity by a licensee.	Vetoed on 9/19/18
<a href="#">AB 1996</a> (Lackey)	This bill renames the California Marijuana Research Program (also known as the Center for Medicinal Cannabis Research) as the California Cannabis Research Program, and expands the potential research areas to include the study of synthetic compounds.	Vetoed on 9/20/18
<a href="#">AB 2020</a> (Quirk)	This bill would authorize the Bureau of Cannabis Control to issue a temporary state license to provide on-site sales and consumption of cannabis at a temporary event located at a fair ground, district agricultural association event, or at another venue expressly approved by a local jurisdiction.	Signed on 9/26/18

Bill Number Author	Summary	Result
<a href="#">AB 2058</a> (Chau)	This bill clarifies that it is unlawful for an individual to drive under the influence of cannabis and a combination of other drugs or alcohol.	Vetoed on 9/21/18
<a href="#">AB 2255</a> (Lackey)	This bill would allow law enforcement to seize and potentially destroy cannabis, in consultation with the Bureau of Cannabis Control (BCC), if a licensed distributor is found to be transporting cannabis or cannabis product that is significantly in excess of the amount stated on the shipping manifest.	Pending Governor Action
<a href="#">AB 2402</a> (Low)	This bill prohibits cannabis licensees from disclosing a consumer's personal information to a third party, except to the extent necessary for payment to be made.	Vetoed on 9/20/18
<a href="#">AB 2721</a> (Quirk)	This bill authorizes cannabis testing laboratories to receive and test samples for cannabis or cannabis products from a person over 21 years of age when the cannabis has been grown by that person and will be used solely for his or her personal use.	Signed on 9/19/18
<a href="#">AB 2799</a> (Jones-Sawyer)	This bill requires an applicant for a state license to provide a statement that the applicant employs, or will employ within one year of receiving a license, an employee who has successfully completed a training course offered by a training provider authorized by an Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) Training Institute Education Center.	Pending Governor Action
<a href="#">AB 2899</a> (Rubio)	This bill prohibits a cannabis licensee from publishing or disseminating advertising or marketing while the licensee's license is suspended.	Pending Governor Action
<a href="#">AB 2914</a> (Cooley)	This bill would prohibit a commercial cannabis licensee from selling, offering, or providing a cannabis product that is an alcoholic beverage, including, but not limited to, an infusion of cannabis or cannabinoids derived from industrial hemp into an alcoholic beverage.	Signed on 9/27/18
<a href="#">AB 2980</a> (Gipson)	This bill redefines "premises" for purposes of licensed cannabis businesses to allow for the sharing of common use areas, such as bathrooms, breakrooms, locker rooms, hallways, or loading docks wherein no license privileges are exercised.	Pending Governor Action

Bill Number Author	Summary	Result
<a href="#">AB 3112</a> (Grayson)	This bill makes it unlawful for a manufacturer, wholesaler, reseller, or retailer, to sell non-odorized butane to a customer, but would exempt from the prohibition certain consumer items such as lighters and small containers of non-odorized butane used to refill these items, and authorizes a civil penalty to be assessed for violations.	Signed on 9/20/18
<a href="#">AB 3069</a> (Cooper)	This bill would have allowed cannabis retailers, cultivators, and manufacturers to participate in a cannabis informational training without a temporary cannabis event license.	Vetoed on 8/29/18

Bill Number Author	Summary	Position
<a href="#">SB 829</a> (Wiener)	This bill allows cannabis licensee holders to donate medicinal cannabis and medicinal cannabis products to qualified patients, and allows such donations to be exempt from the cultivation tax, the use tax, and the excise tax.	Pending Governor Action
<a href="#">SB 1127</a> (Hill)	This bill would authorize the governing board of a school district, a county board of education, or the governing body of a charter school to adopt a policy that allows a parent or guardian to administer non-smokeable and non-vapeable medicinal cannabis to an authorized pupil at a schoolsite under specific conditions.	Pending Governor Action
<a href="#">SB 1294</a> (Bradford)	This bill establishes the California Cannabis Equity Act of 2018, which will allow a local jurisdiction to submit an application to the Bureau of Cannabis Control (Bureau) for a grant to assist local equity applicants and local equity licensees through that local jurisdiction's equity program.	Signed on 9/26/18
<a href="#">SB 1409</a> (Wilk)	This bill updates existing California law pertaining to the production and cultivation of industrial hemp.	Pending Governor Action
<a href="#">SB 1451</a> (Fuller)	This bill establishes minimum penalties for cannabis licensees who furnish cannabis or cannabis products to unauthorized individuals.	Vetoed on 9/10/18
